A Family for ME is a partnership between the Department of Health and Human Services and Spurwink Services. Our objective is to increase awareness about the urgent need for foster and adoptive families in Maine. We do this by working in coordination with various organizations to educate, provide literature and ask for assistance in disseminating information.

A Family for ME has a strong, successful history of collaborating with many different faith-based groups, and we are asking you to assist if you are able.

With more than 6,000 walkers, it is bound to be a large amount for increased capacity for lifesaving research and treatment, including care for people from Maine through a collaboration with Northern Light Health.

The walk was not in Boston this year due to the pandemic. My friend Joanne and I walked our 13 miles around Back Cove in Portland and Frye Island in Sebago Lake. We had comfortable temperatures and only a little light rain. I was pleased to carry names of loved ones that many of you wanted to honor, remember, support, and celebrate.

UPDATE ON SUPPLY PASTORS

During this period between Rev Schulte leaving the interim position and the Search Committee finding a designated-term pastor we are fortunate to have access in this area to a variety of pulpit supply pastors. For three weeks this fall we enjoyed the ministry and sermons of Rev. Jim Scovil. He reminded us of our roots with the Bangor Homeless Shelter, the Ecumenical Food Cupboard, and our commitment to giving to the wider church. For multiple Sundays in October and November we will have the services of the Reverends Mary Angela Davis and Nick Davis. This husband and wife team from Ellsworth, Maine blessed us with their first appearance last Sunday. There are still some Sundays in October and November where we need to acquire the services of a supply pastor. Maine Conference staff is assisting us in this endeavor.

The Search Committee's hope is to have a designated-term pastor start at some point during the Advent season. We have a nearly complete Church Profile, we are working with information from the Vision group, and we are actively considering several candidates.

Please pray for our committee's progress that God will guide us through this so important journey.

INTERACTING WITH WABANAKI-MAINE HISTORY - MONDAY, NOVEMBER 1ST AT 6PM ON ZOOM

This program, hosted by the Maine UCC, is a two hour interactive experience in which we engage in a story of particular events in the history of 400-years of colonization of Wabanaki people by Europeans in this territory now called the state of Maine.

This highly engaging experience requires our full participation in order to genuinely increase our understanding of colonization and what it means for current descendants and future generations; to reflect on what story we are writing for our grandchildren. We ask participants to participate with their cameras on throughout the presentation in order to experience the program to its fullest.

Upon recommendation from Wabanaki REACH, given the subject matter we will be discussing and the length of time we will be gathered together on zoom, we will need at least 20 participants to run the workshop and will need to cap attendance at 50. Should we get 50 registrations quickly and, when you sign up, you find that this program is full, that will be a sign to us that we should organize a second workshop with this information. We will have a sign up sheet available for those who wish to register for a future workshop. Please contact Rev.
