VETERANS DAY 2021

Change is inevitable. So, yes, as many of you know, Veterans Day started out as "Armistice Day" on Nov 11, 1919 which marked the first anniversary of the end of World War I. It continued to be an important marker in the hearts and minds of citizens so Congress made it an annual observance by a resolution passed in 1926 and in 1938 it gained more status when it became a national holiday. Finally, President Eisenhower changed the name to "Veterans Day" in 1954.

Today Veterans Day commemorates men and women, living and dead, who have been involved in every war since the founding of our country.

At Hammond Street Congregational Church, we have a rich history of involvement in the various branches of the U.S. Military and have Honor Rolls for WW1 and WW2 displayed in the Narthex.

Recently while reading through our wonderful old record books starting in 1833, I became aware of at least 14 men who were veterans of our country's Civil War. At the time of their enlistment, two were former members serving in Regiments from Massachusetts and Illinois while all the rest served in a number of Maine Regiments. Sadly, four died as a result of wounds or disease (see* below) and at least six (Capt. Anson, Lt. Duren, H.F. Hanson, Gen. Hodsdon, Maj. Pitcher, Maj. Webster) are buried at Mt Hope Cemetery in Bangor. Here is the Honor Roll of our Civil War Veterans:

Capt. George Hammond Anson, *Justin Turner Bourne, Sgt. James Albert Dole, Lt. Charles Maltby Duren (MA), *Capt. Eugene Wallace Godfrey (IL), Dr. Horace Franklin Hanson, *Edward Warren Hanson, Capt. Levi Lindley Hawes, Adj. Gen. of ME John Littlefield Hodsdon, Daniel Holman, Jr., *Maj. William Leonard Pitcher, Elijah Rogers, Capt. Francis Willard Webster, Maj. George Webster.

This November 11, once again, we remember all members of the military, past and present, as well as their loved ones, and express our gratitude for their loyal and faithful service and sacrifice.
