March Notes from Council/Executive Committee



- A Communication covenant was accepted and our thanks to Judy Fricke & Lori Spencer for putting a condensed version together from everyone's input from our past meetings. We shall be sharing it with the congregation in the near future.
- Judy and the music committee have been busy arranging for concerts over the next few months. (May & June) More information will be coming soon.
- We shall look at setting up a "virtual" date to connect again with Rev. Paul Nickerson to look at our next steps in our healing conversations and a service. Paul will work closely with Rev. Bagley in moving forward.
- Changes coming out of our Safety Committee starting April 1st, 2022
 - 1. Masks will be recommended, but not required, during worship service, and particularly recommended during singing of hymns.
 - 2. Return to distributing the elements to people in pews during communion. Bread will only be in cubes and no one taking a piece from the loaf.
 - 3. All verses of hymns may be sung, with masks recommended.
 - 4. We will begin to offer "modest" snacks during coffee hour.
 - 5. Sunday School will meet in classroom and fellowship hall once teachers are found.

We will continue with the following protocols:

- Hand sanitizers and masks available throughout the building
- Continue practices to increase ventilation and monitor CO2 levels
- Choir will continue to wear masks until Penobscot County level is low
- Continue social distancing, sitting in every other pew (ones with hymnals and Bible in them)





On the corner of Hammond and High Streets in Bangor


