STEWARDSHIP MOMENT:

We at stewardship wanted to keep you up to date with our GIFT campaign. To date, \$140,931 has been pledged toward the 2023 proposed budget of \$226,680. That means we will be short \$85,749 to fund the various programs, positions, and expenses that HSCC requires. Some might say, "why not use the investments?" The trustees have two answers to that question; first, the investments would soon be gone if we tapped into them every time our pledges were short. Second, the investments have been earmarked for emergencies, such as our boiler that is about to fail.

Christmas is the season of giving, and we would like to encourage all of you to give a one-time gift for the advent season. No gift is too small or too big – every penny counts! Growing In Faith Together – That's what we do best. Let's share our wonderful HSCC – bring a friend or co-worker to church this month. Every Sunday has something special... let's share our GIFTs with as many people as possible!

2022 MEMBERSHIP DUES:

Have you paid your membership dues for 2022? What are the dues and where does the money go?

Our UCC State Conference and our Association (Katahdin Association) asks each church to pay dues. This year the dues are \$18 per member; this amounts to \$4,000 for HSCC annually. Ninety percent of the monies collected are sent to our State Conference for them to continue their work in our State, the remaining ten percent is sent to our Katahdin Association. The monies are used to support the conferences and their work at both the State and Local levels.
