SCRIPTURE 2 Corinthians 4:1

Therefore, since it is by God's mercy that we are engaged in this ministry, we do not lose heart.

WORDS OF HOPE

While there is more to this passage than this opening line, this one line stuck out to me. It struck me because of a quote I recently came across from former slave and ardent abolitionist Frederick Douglass. "One and God make a majority". While my basic understanding of these two quotes tells me they are different, I also see a commonality in them.

These two carry a theme that runs throughout the teachings of the Bible. It is said in many ways. In the letter to the Romans, Paul says "If God is for us who can be against us?" The Gospel of Matthew states: "they shall name him Emmanuel which means God is with us."

That is what I see as a main message from the life of Jesus. That is what I hear in the words of Douglass. People who walk with God can accomplish all the things through that relationship with God that God wants to see done. For Douglass that was abolition.

For us that might be justice: racial justice, housing justice, food justice, justice in all forms. I have a belief that these are not unrelated. They all fall into what we called "humanity's inhumanity to humanity" when I was in literature classes. With God we can, we must, become more humane to God's creation; of which we are part and parcel.

DID YOU KNOW:

that HSCC is part of the Katahdin Association which is a network of UCC churches based on geographical location in ME? Our Assoc. has 3 scheduled meetings -- a Midwinter meeting in Feb, an Annual Meeting in June & a Semi-Annual Meeting in Oct -- where pastors & delegates from each church, as well as members, meet to report, discuss & tend to Assoc. business. This business is funded by dues assessed yearly based on each church's membership. Then, of course, after the meetings there is the joy of seeing old friends & making new ones plus getting together in fellowship and enjoying a delicious meal! As with churches, service is also part of the Assoc., perhaps hands-on or financial support of groups in the area. One major function of the Assoc. is to work with churches at the time of ministerial changes & oversee & work with candidates who feel called to ministry - hopefully ending with an Ecclesiastical Council & Ordination in coordination with the sponsoring church. Ecclesiastical Councils are also called when there are new church starts. 190 years ago, a Council of the Penobscot Assoc., the predecessor of the Katahdin Assoc., voted to allow the formation of HSCC.
