Palm Sunday - Suggested Reading: Matthew 21:1-11

Prayer for Palm Sunday

Holy Week Wednesday - Suggested Reading: John 12:36b

God, please help us develop a practice of silence. While we try to ignore all the distractions around us and be still, please help our chattering minds return to the silence. May we hear your voice in quiet moments. Amen.

Holy Week Thursday, Maundy Thursday - Suggested Reading: Mark 14:22-24 Service at 7:00 pm Prayer for Holy Week Thursday

When we smell the wonderful scent of baking bread or eat a freshly baked loaf, may we remember that special meal Jesus had with his disciples. May we remember that, just as Jesus ate around a table with disciples, he is near to us, too. Amen.

We started this week by saying "Hosanna!!" We end it by saying "Hallelujah!" Thank you, God, for all the good gifts of Easter. Thank you for the hope that comes when the tomb is empty. Christ is Risen! He has risen indeed.

To make your cross. Start with 1 palm. Most of them are actually 2 connected together, so if it easily splits into 2 palms, separate them completely. One thickness will be easier to fold. (Taken from Catholic Icing website)

 Fold the palm down, not in half.
The length of the short side will be the length of your cross.



4. Fold the long side of the palm forward at the length you want the other arm of your cross to be.



7. Now, fold the end up parallel to the arms of the cross.



 Wind the tail around the same piece until there is not enough left to wind anymore. Turn it over so the long side of the palm is facing you. Fold the long side back at a 45 degree angle. This will make one arm of your cross.



5. Fold the pointy end of the palm up at a 45 degree angle.



8. Fold it across the back again at another 45 degree angle.

3. Fold the long side of the palm back at the length you want the arm of your cross to be.



6. Fold the palm down around the back.



Now, bring the tail of the palm down and thread it under the piece in the back.



Place your finished cross under something heavy to flatten the folds and keep it looking nice.
