SCRIPTURE

Matthew 12:38-42

Then some of the scribes and Pharisees said to him, "Teacher, we wish to see a sign from you." But he answered them, "An evil and adulterous generation asks for a sign, but no sign will be given to it except the sign of the prophet Jonah. For just as Jonah was three days and three nights in the belly of the sea monster, so for three days and three nights the Son of Man will be in the heart of the earth. The people of Nineveh will rise up at the judgment with this generation and condemn it, because they repented at the proclamation of Jonah, and indeed something greater than Jonah is here!

The queen of the South will rise up at the judgment with this generation and condemn it, because she came from the ends of the earth to listen to the wisdom of Solomon, and indeed something greater than Solomon is here!

WORDS OF HOPE

The Pharisees were always questioning Jesus, trying to catch him in some kind of theological trap, and this passage is another example of that. What spoke to me was the mention of the Queen of the South, and of course my queer mind cannot hear that phrase without envisioning one of the many drag queens I have known in my life. Having lived in Texas, a number of them have been southern drag queens and they seem to have the most delightfully acerbic and playfully venomous way of putting rowdy hecklers in their place.

I know the phrase refers to the Queen of Sheba in scripture, but I would love seeing the Pharisees come up against the force of nature that is a southern drag queen. I envision her letting them know that their skepticism and convoluted questioning missed the whole point of Jesus teachings.

"Ya'll got your noses so high you'd drown in a rainstorm," she would say. "Ya'll had better sit yourself down and listen to this man."

After they had followed her instructions, she would have ended the conversation with the quintessential Southern capper," Bless your hearts."

WEEKLY FLOWER DEDICATIONS

This is just a reminder that the flowers are a beautiful addition to our weekly Sunday services and now is the time of the year to start signing up ahead of time for any dedications that you would like to donate the flowers for to save your date before it's gone. We can only take up to two arrangements per Sunday. Please sign up in the book on the table in the back of the Sanctuary on Sundays or call the office no later than Tuesday of any week to sign up.

DID YOU KNOW

that the designer of the Ascension-themed stainedglass window over the pulpit, E. P. Treadwell of Boston, designed our next set of windows? When Mrs. Mary E. (Woodhull) Perry (1844-1910) contacts us to have windows placed in the sanctuary in memory of her parents, Rev. Richard (1802-1873) & Sarah (Forbes) Woodhull (1809-1882), Pastor Griffin suggests the Resurrection theme. Mr. Treadwell submits a sketch for the top third of the two windows on the High Street side - the bottom 2/3 being covered by blinds. In an April 19, 1884, note, he titles the scene "Angels Guarding the Sepulcher" & writes "the figures...will be treated in pure mosaic of colored glass in very delicate tints...& a very slight modeling given to the drapery. All the variation of color in the drapery & wings will be in the glass itself, being caused by opalescence with a slight rosy tinge in the drapery & soft pigeon wing shades of many colors in the wings." During the windows' dedication Nov 26, 1885, Pastor Griffin describes & talks about the Angel of Strength (left) & the Angel of Compassion (right.) In 1959 the windows are removed & stored in a closet until discovered in the late 1990's. A decision is made to restore the Angel of Compassion & in 1997 is installed over the back door where it dazzles observers when the sun shines through it just as it did when it first graced the sanctuary. Its "mate" is given in partial payment to the restorer.


