## **SUMMER WORSHIP**

June will be a time of exciting services of worship as we begin the month with Children's Sunday.

On June 4<sup>th</sup> the children of Hammond Street Church will lead us in Worship. They will be in charge of the entire service even presenting the message. Make plans to be a part of this special service.

Then on Sunday, June 25<sup>th</sup> we will celebrate Pride Sunday. Saturday, June 24<sup>th</sup> will be a day of celebration as we march in the Pride parade and have a booth at the Pride Festival downtown. Our service on Sunday will focus on diversity and the acceptance of all people.

Beginning in July we will have a more relaxed time of worship. The choir will be on vacation, but worship will continue with more informal liturgy and the singing of your favorite hymns. To make all this happen we will need to hear from you. There will be forms on the tables at the entrance of the Sanctuary for you to pick up and in the Hammond Streeter as well. All you have to do is fill in the form with your favorite hymns and return them to the church and we will begin on July 2, singing those hymns. This will continue through August. We look forward to getting your list.

#### **DID YOU KNOW**

That the first Memorial Day, May 5, 1869, is the result of a group of Union army veterans who want to honor their fallen Civil War comrades & this involves decorating their graves with flowers, hence the first name for the day -- Decoration Day. This tradition evolves to include those military personnel killed in all wars & the day of recognition becomes the last Monday in May when graves are once more decorated-- now with flags & flowers as well as tears & 2023 marks 154 years of remembering & honoring. Our records show 19 members serve in the Civil War. Four never returned: Justin T Bourne, Capt. Eugene W Godfrey, Edward W Hanson, Maj William L Pitcher. In a book compiled by our Clerk, Carl E. Delano, for our 100th Anniversary, he lists 28 other men who serve & half do not survive. None are members but perhaps relatives of members. While no Honor Roll has been found for WW I, records show one member, James G Somers, dies in France. Our WW II Honor Roll hanging in the Narthex lists 115 individuals -- 5 with a gold star of which 2 are members -- Lawrence R Blethen, Claire F Dunphey; 2 have unknown connections & 1 is the son of members Fred G & Alice Easton, Sr. It is in memory of Capt. Harold G Eaton (who went to sea at age 16 in 1900) that the American flag in our sanctuary is given & a plaque on the pole tells the sad story.

## JOIN THE CONCERT PARKING FUNDRAISING

HSCC has a great opportunity (thanks to Susan Gildart) to raise funds by assisting with parking in the Shaw's lot for Waterfront Concerts. **Our first concert will be on Friday, July 7, when Chris Stapleton performs**. This will be one of the biggest concerts of the year.

Shaw's makes space available in their parking lot and allows non-profit groups to monitor the lot and share the proceeds from concert parking. We will be working with another non-profit group who have done this before; they will show us the ropes. We need 16 volunteers to each work a 4 ½ hour shift. Eight from noon to 4:30 and 8 from 4:30 to 9. The volunteers monitor the lot to be sure that people parking there are concert attendees and pay the fee. Only one person collects money; that will be someone from the other group we are working with.

If you can be on your feet, outdoors, for most of 4 ½ hours and be nice but firm with people about parking in the designated area, you are qualified! Wear comfy shoes and dress for the weather.
