

# **SCRIPTURE**

Psalm 119:10

"I am deeply troubled; preserve my life, O God, according to your word."

# **WORDS OF HOPE**

Are there days when the news reports or the complaints and discord on social media become too much to bear? We live in a very troubled world, a time of constant crisis, change and fear. Recognizing that fact, I'm old enough to know that almost every generation of humanity, sooner or later, comes face-to-face with tragedy and deep uncertainty.

How did we deal with troubling situations then? How do individuals cope today? To whom do they turn for solace and help? What do the words of the Lord say about this matter; do they offer promises of help to assure us during difficult times?

Let's turn back to a generation a few thousand years ago. The Psalmists were not strangers to stress, pressure, and discord in generous proportions. Consider the wisdom of some of their thoughts, words to incorporate in our own daily prayers:

"For God alone my soul in silence waits... God alone is my rock and my salvation... my stronghold, so that I shall not be greatly shaken... In God is my safety and my honor... my refuge." (Psalm 62:1-2, 7-8)

"In you, O Lord, I take refuge; let me never be put to shame. In your righteousness deliver me... incline your ear to me and save me... for you, O Lord, are my hope and my trust... upon you, I have leaned throughout my life... I know you will not cast me off in my old age or forsake me when my strength is spent." (Psalm 71:1-2, 5-6, 9)

Many of us have committed the 23rd Psalm to heart. Consider and meditate on these verses from that familiar ancient prayer: "Even though I walk through the darkest valley, I fear no evil; for you are with me... You will anoint my head with oil, my cup overflows. Surely goodness and your mercy shall follow me all the days of my life." (Psalm 23:4-6)

So, you see that God has many words which offer a promise of assurance for those who choose to walk through life together with the Divine. Hang onto that divine hand and these promises each day!

# **DID YOU KNOW**

That November 11th, Veteran's Day, is set aside to honor all men and women who have ever or now serve in all branches of our military. Originally called Armistice Day in 1919, it celebrated the 1st Anniversary of the end of WW I &, with legislative action through the years, it has evolved to its current state. HSCC has created honor rolls for the major conflicts in which our folks have been involved starting with the Civil War. In our 100th Year Memorial book, 42 men are listed & there is a framed honor roll naming 115 WW II participants hanging in the Narthex (front entrance). Our scrapbook from 1916-1920 contains a number of interesting Daily Commercial articles with information regarding WW I, one of which is a review of our 1918 Annual Meeting listing the names of 46 men who served. It also reports that Judge Warren, leader of the young men's class at HSCC, shares at a meeting that one of their group, James Gordon Somers, "...was killed instantly in France while attending the wounded on the field of battle ...(and) cited for gallantry on the field;" in addition, two others from the Warren Class, Henry W. Kelley & Foster Tuell had been injured. Other clippings on WW I were written by or about our former Pastor, Rev. Christopher W. Collier & relate his first-hand experiences & stories because he took a leave from the church in Lexington, MA to served in France for 6 months with the Ambulance Corp. This November 11th, once again, let us remember & honor all members of the military, past & present, as well as their loved ones & their various communities, & express our gratitude for their loyal & faithful service & sacrifices of many types.

To honor this, our 190th year as Hammond Street Church, you have received "C.I." generated material on a weekly basis regarding all things historical in the form of "Did You Know..." articles appearing in the bulletin and newsletter and, at Easter, a booklet of highlights from the past 15 years (copies still available--just ask.) 
