WORDS OF HOPE

Inner Peace

Peace is quiet and not loud, still and not in a hurry, surrendered and not struggling, and simply is, without trying to be. Imagine a secret garden that grew without anyone ever helping it. The sun is shining on patches of daisies, lilies, and dandelions spread about the garden randomly in various colors. A small stream stretches the length of the garden flowing in the direction of a great mountain in the distance. Throughout the garden are many apple trees in season with both red and green apples. Finally, the grass is both soft and long, and bows as the wind dances through the garden.

Conversely, chaos is loud and not quiet, in a hurry and not still, struggling and not surrendered, and trying to be but is not there yet. Imagine a storm raging at sea and being caught trying to sail through it. Thunder is booming while lighting is striking. The wind is fighting against everything in its path. Water has become waves driven by the wind and is striking your boat. A tornado is forming in the sky while rain beats down heavily on your face, and you can see nothing.

Nature shows us what peace and chaos look like, however; it is our hearts that feel its effects. When our emotions guide us, our hearts become as changeable as the weather; but when we guide our emotions, we become immovable. There is peace even on cloudy days in a heart that is quiet, still, surrendered, and simply is, without trying to be. Grow a garden in the sanctuary of your heart and fill it with all the things that bring you joy. Take care of it and never neglect it. Your peace of mind depends on how well you maintain your garden. The storm that rages on the outside does not reach the peace that you keep on the inside. This is what the ancients called 'Inner Peace'.

CHURCH CLERK NEEDED

a three-year position, elected by the congregation at the Annual Meeting. The duties and responsibilities are laid down in the by-laws as follows. The Clerk shall keep a record and oversee the distribution of minutes of all business meetings of the church, of the Church Council, and of the Executive Committee; keep on file all official reports, give legal notice of all corporation meetings, notify all officers, members of committees and delegates of their election; and keep an accurate register, with name, date, and classification of all member admissions, dismissions, deaths, and baptisms. The Clerk shall be legally sworn.

DID YOU KNOW

That in 1827, while our first pastor, Rev. John Maltby, Jr. was serving his first parish in Sutton, MA, Margaret Graves (Jackson) (1797-1852) became his wife and, when they arrived in Bangor in July of 1834, they had 5 children -- John Rogers 6 yrs, Margaret Loraine 4 1/2, William Jackson 3, Susan Elizabeth 2 & Samuel Chauncey 1-month old. What an "active" household that must have been. But in 1860, when Rev. Enoch Pond writes about his deceased brother-in-law's time at Hammond Street Church he notes Rev. Maltby was tried by "...bereavements in his family..." Indeed life took on a somber tone in a series of deaths: son Samuel in 1835. sister Julia A. (Maltby) Pond in 1838; their next child, Samuel Jackson 1839-1841; his father in 1842, in 1847, 3 grandchildren including 7-month old twins, his wife Margaret in 1852, & a son-in-law in 1855. On a cheerier note, the good Rev. had the support of & was survived by his children John R. (1828-1895), Margaret L. (Maltby) Crosby (1829-1913), William J. (1831-1860), Susan E. (Maltby) {Winn} Partridge (1832-1903) & Henrietta C. (Maltby) Cushman (1836-1921) plus numerous grandchildren. Rev. Pond also reminds us of the deceased's social & spiritual virtues -- the former being a direct outgrowth of the later that is, a strong sense of honor, honesty & kind, just, courteous & sympathetic actions had their roots in the fruits of the spirit -- "love, joy, peace, long suffering, gentleness, goodness & faith."2 So as a devoted shepherd of the flock he cared tenderly & worked tirelessly for all --old & young, rich poor, honored & less so-- & sought out & visited the sick & troubled & held them in power-filled prayers. Adding to this his gift of stirring preaching, is it any wonder that in 1883 when parishioners looked back over the first 50 years, they decided to give a window in his honor. Thanks be to God, as we celebrate our 190th year, for the strong social & spiritual legacy & foundation on which we continue to build! Part 2 of 2

Please make sure the backdoor is locked when you leave. Lock it and give it a tug to make sure it is secure and make sure your vehicle is locked.


VIDEO TAPING SUNDAY SERVICES
