Interacting with Wabanaki - Maine History Saturday, September 28, 2024, 9 A.M. A program offered over a zoom link.

The Executive Committee is continuing an emphasis at the Association level of working toward a better understanding of our sisters and brothers of the Wabanaki peoples here in Maine. We have engaged with Wabanaki Reach (wabanakireach.org for you to explore) to offer the "Interacting with Wabanaki - Maine History" program on the last Saturday in September. a couple of the committee have experienced it before and could speak personally to the value it offers in a 2 hour session. We will stay on for a 1/2 hour after the program to help attendees process what they have seen and heard. This is the description of the program from their website: "This program is an interactive experience in which we engage in a story of particular events in the history of 400 years of colonization of Wabanaki people by Europeans in this territory now called the state of Maine. This highly engaging experience requires our full participation in order to genuinely increase our understanding of colonization and what it means for current descendants and future generations; to reflect on what story we are writing for our grandchildren."

The program is interactive with attendees being given simple tasks to help increase awareness in small ways of what tribal members have experienced since Europeans first came to these shores of what is called "Dawnland" by those native to this place. I expect that the link will open 15 minutes before the program. We are limited to 50 participants using the link via Zoom. Should there be more than 50 wanting to attend I will be limiting each church to 2 or 3 or 4 participants.

Be sure to offer your name and the email address at which you expect an answer. There is no cost for this as it will be covered by our Association.

A reminder email will come out a week before the registration deadline.
